



Board of Representatives (BOR) Meeting
Minutes of September 19, 2019

President, Thao Tiedt, called the BOR Meeting to order at 8:30 AM.

Invocation Chaplain, Hal Neubeurger, Santa Cruz Valley Regional Hospital, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance

President Thao introduced Don Weaver who gave a Eulogy in honor of Russel Symes, Past President of the Green Valley Council.

President Thao presented the financial report, which was accepted. Thao reported that this would be a tough year. The revenues expected from the Directory will not materialize because of a change in their business model.

 - The Sherriff's Commission advisory Board is to provide community feedback – and in doing so the Sherriff should appoint the members of the Commission not the Board of supervisors.
