More road repairs for greater Green Valley, costing \$17.4 million, will occur during Pima County Fiscal Year, July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Local Green Valley streets scheduled for work are located in Desert Meadows II, Esperanza Estates, Portillo Place, Foothills II, Fairways, Pasadera, Madera Foothills Estates, Colonia Real, and Canoa Preserve. Arterial and collector roads scheduled for repair in the Green Valley area include Arivaca Ranch Road, Arivaca Road, Arivaca Sasabe Road, Camino Holgado, Desert Ridge Drive, Elephant Head Road, Hawk Way, Helmet Peak Road, Mission Road (West Duval Mine Road to 1,888 ft. South of W. Twin Buttes Road), Mission Twin Buttes Road, and Universal Road.

Pima County is prioritizing road repairs for streets with a PCI rating below 60 over the next 10 years and is using a “StreetSaver Pavement Management Program,” based on modeling the maximum return on investment for arterial and collector roads (Mary Glen Hatcher, Green Valley News, April 30, 2021).
