



BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES MEETING MINUTES DECEMBER 19, 2024

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance: Invocation was led by Pastor Ryan Walters

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made and seconded to approve the November Minutes

Approval of Financial Statement: After details provided by David a motion was made and seconded to approve the Financial Statement

Elections: Candidates for re-election on the Executive Board of GVC (Debbie Kenyon, President; Royal Martin, VP; and Bob Quast Member at Large) were brought before the members and were unanimously voted in for a new term.

Supervisor Christy: The Supervisor mentioned a commission has been formed, The Mitigation Council, to study and analyze the issues with homeowner insurance. The Supervisor stated he wants representation for all areas of Pima County. He further detailed the Firewise program, encouraging everyone to become involved to lower homeowner insurance costs. The Supervisor also discussed RTA2 and stated ridership has increased and he wants the bus service to be extended. He fielded questions on the Firewise program, as well as the Mitigation Council. The Supervisor then stated Tom Berezny is leaving and detailed the many achievements and contributions Tom has made as the Supervisors representative in District 4. He also discussed Commander Kenyon leaving his post of many years, and detailed the many achievements and contributions Commander Kenyon has made as SAV Commander. The Supervisor announced that Commander Doug Kenyon will replace Tom Berezny as the Supervisors representative in District 4, to cheers from the floor and a standing ovation.

Tom Berezny: Tom updated on the progress of the Campbell Rd. extension, and noted bids have gone out for the design process to begin.

Commander Kenyon: Reporting for Lt. Rodriguez, Commander Kenyon detailed the numbers of traffic stops, citations, arrests and DUI's. Reporting for SAV, Commander Kenyon detailed the numbers of park patrols, mileage, and home checks.

Matt Smoger: Matt presented the Commander with a large donation from Freeport-McMoRan to be used for SAV vehicles.

Cari Olvera: Cari, with Northwest Hospital, introduced their new surgeon who detailed the many surgical services available at the hospital.

President Kenyon: The President reported Canoa Estates wish to again become a member of GVC. The President asked for a vote, it was unanimously voted in. She also detailed the last GVC forum, a proposal to create a Wildlife Refuge on the I19 corridor from the border to Tucson. She stated there are many unanswered questions and she will be waiting for more information. The President also detailed a recent meeting with Jan Leshner and Carmine Debonis from Pima County to report on the many activities, events, forums and meetings GVC has held this year to benefit all Green Valley, and to discuss GVC's hopes for land in which to build a new office to accommodate the many meetings and administrative needs that occur daily. The President then thanked Tom Berezny for his years of working with GVC to better GV in every way. President Kenyon then presented Commander Kenyon with the Volunteer Career Award for his many years of service in GV.
